

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING  
SOUTH JERSEY REGION – SPORTS CAR CLUB OF AMERICA, INC.  
JULY 2022

The July 2022 meeting of the Board of Directors for the South Jersey Region of the Sports Car Club of America, Inc. was held at the home of Mike LaMaina on Wednesday evening, July 6, 2022. The meeting was called to order by R.E., Jim Tornetta at 7:10PM.

Present were Mike LaMaina, Sue King, Steve Thomas, Jim Tornetta, Steve Kado, Bill Richter, Joshua Kuehne, and John Hainsworth. Guests were: Bill VonSuskil, Matt Wojtkowiak, Dan Zane, Ed Jenks, Tom Ghan, Jim Wakemen, Sr. and Jim Wakemen, Jr.

Treasurers Report – Mike LaMaina reported on the following balances in our various accounts: race account, \$108,658.00; operating account, \$39,744.00; scholarship account, \$3,629.00; and our running deposit with NJMP \$20,000.00. Mike further reported that we had a loss of \$10,000.00 +/-, with a little over 100 entrants for the race event and 60 entrants for the practice day. There is an outstanding charge for oil dry in the amount of \$225.00. Sue King will follow up on that charge. Mike then went over income/expenses since March.

Rally Report – Jim Wakemen, Sr. reported that our recent rally event had income to the good of \$134.30. Jim went on to report that the Appalachian Rally, which started in 1973, will be running its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2023. This may be a national tour event. Ed Jenks asked about doing a rally for Corvettes in conjunction with Ciocca and he asked for Jim Sr.'s help in planning this event. Discussion centered on entry fee for this rally and Jim Sr. replied that payment to SCCA for regional rallies is \$19.50 per entrant and payment to SCCA for social rallies is \$4.00 per entrant so entry fee should be figured on these costs. Discussion followed for 2023 events.

Time Trials Report – Joshua Kuehne reported on the most recent track day held at NJMP wherein there were 79 entrants who got 7 runs. August 6-7 is the next event which will be the Global Time Attack. Joshua reported that he has scheduled a track days event in conjunction with our Summer Thunder race event to be held August 13/14 on Thunderbolt.

Autocross Report – Bill Richter reported on our July 3<sup>rd</sup> autocross event held at Bader Field wherein there were 79 entrants who got 7 runs each. August 13/14 is the planned schedule for our annual charity autocross Battle at the Bay. Perhaps we will have a cars and coffee in conjunction with Ciocca Corvette in conjunction with the Battle. Bill will be ordering t-shirts and trophies for the Battle. Bill went on to report that our September autocross event is planned for September 26<sup>th</sup>. Bill will get our SCCA sanctions for future autocross events updated.

Membership Report – John Hainsworth reported that we have 524 members to date with 88 of those members holding full competition licenses; 13 new members since April 1<sup>st</sup>; 3 hill climb licenses; 14 novice permits; 43TT licenses of which 23 are novices, 17 intermediate, 2 advanced, and 1 pro.

Race Report – Jim Tornetta reported on our upcoming Majors event. Steve Thomas has received the Majors flags which are in Sue's possession. It was the BoD's decision that we will be serving our volunteers our standard meals. As to track food, Jim and J.D. will be meeting with Brad (NJMP) to go over food costs. Ed Jenks reported that we will have a car corral at the Majors event on Saturday with roughly 100+/- Corvettes participating from 9am to 12noon. Ed plans on special t-shirts, pamphlets, and

business cards. There will be a separate lane for the Corvettes to enter into track. There will be 4 signs with directions. Ed has ordered trophies.

Old Business – Bill VonSuskil reported that PMN will be broadcasting live from Thunderbolt tower and various locations around the track during our Majors event. Bill went on to report about the Urban League Racing School's upcoming event to be held at Fairmont Park Memorial Hall on July 22<sup>nd</sup> which will feature not only students from the school but also NASCAR drivers that will be racing at Pocono that weekend. The school has asked for our help by supplying SCCA flaggers. They are looking for race cars and Ciocca will be supplying Corvettes. Bill VonSuskil is the main contact for this event. Dan Zane will be bringing the race truck and radios.

New Business – Ed Jenks will be working with Ciocca Corvettes to have some of their members to participate at our remaining 2022 race events. Perhaps Toys for Tots and Time Trials. Mike LaMaina reported that there is a change to the Summer Thunder supps wherein there will be frou (4) practice sessions. Discussion centered on pit signs and long pants in the pit lane. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:25PM.
